- ❖ You've heard the joke that the only two seasons in Pennsylvania are
Winter and Road Construction. It seems that Winter is finally gone,
so that can only mean one thing...road repair time! Plenty of
potholes have popped up throughout the Borough and repairs are
scheduled to begin in May. It's been a long and unpredictable
winter, so we appreciate your patience.
- ❖ In the mood for Spring cleaning? Two upcoming events will get
you off to a good start:
 - *ROLL OFF DUMPSTERS will be available from May 17 to
May 22 for larger items not permitted in dumpsters.
 - *Get rid of unwanted junk mail at a SHREDDING EVENT on
Saturday, May 19.
 - *Both of these events are for **Pennsbury residents only** and a
flyer will be distributed with further details. Proof of
residency required at Shredding Event.
- ❖ As a reminder, construction material, appliances and electronic
devices are never permitted to be disposed of in the dumpsters
(including the roll-off ones). Waste Management offers a removal
service for such items. Please contact them at 1-800-449-7587 to
set up a collection appointment.
- ❖ Please place trash in bags before discarding in any dumpster. This
prevents trash from spilling out around the dumpsters and into our
community, and it also discourages pests. Let's all do our part to
help keep Pennsbury beautiful.

From the Office of the Tax Collector:

As a Homeowner you are responsible for all taxes and fees issued by the Tax Collector. Please make sure the Tax Office has your current mortgage company information or your personal mailing information if you pay your own taxes. **Failure to receive your tax and refuse bills is NOT an acceptable excuse for not paying your taxes and refuse fees on time.**

If you do not receive your tax or refuse bills by the following dates, please notify the Tax Collector, Patricia Notaro, at 412-276-6181.

Refuse Bills – Due date was January 31st. Any refuse bill still outstanding continues to incur a \$5 per month penalty plus a \$12.50 administrative fee.

Borough Taxes – Mailed in April and due at a discount by May 31. Payments later than this will be assessed at face value/penalty. **If you haven't received your tax bill by May 5th and pay your own taxes, call 412-276-6181 for a duplicate bill.**

School Taxes – Mailed in August and due at discount by September 30. If you haven't received your tax bill by September 5th and pay your own taxes, call 412-276-6181 for a duplicate bill.

Taxes NOT collected by Tax Collector:

County Taxes – handled through the County Tax office - not Pennsbury – make sure the County has your current mailing information. (412-350-4600).

Wage Tax - All employed residents of Pennsbury Village must pay Wage Tax to Jordan Tax Service at 412-835-5243, #6.

Business Privilege Tax – This tax is due for anyone operating a business out of their residence and ALL landlords renting a unit. Contact Jordan Tax Service at 412-835-5243, #8.

New Website: Members of Borough Council have been working hard on a new and improved website for Pennsbury residents. In addition to being easier to use, the site will contain plenty of useful information. We will let you know when it goes live so you can check it out.

Scott Township EMS: Soon you will receive your annual information about Scott Township's EMS service. Though we hope you never have to use it, this subscription can save you substantial money should an emergency situation arise. Please review the material when it arrives.

Pennsbury's Generosity:

The Borough of Pennsbury Village's Semi-Annual Food Drive for the Crafton United Presbyterian Food Pantry will be conducted in late May or early June. A flyer will be distributed to notify you of the date, time and collection location. Thank you, in advance, for your generosity!

Reminders:

Pennsbury has a leash law requiring all pets to be on a leash when out of the unit. Also, you **MUST** pick up after your dog, and you can be fined if reported for not doing so. In addition to being unsightly, pet excrement is unsanitary and can attract rodents.

With summer coming, remember that Pennsbury has a noise ordinance that is enforced by the Carnegie Police. Call 911 for noise disturbances after 11 p.m.

The Borough speed limit is 15 mph. Obey the speed limit and stop/yield signs at all times.
