

ORDINANCE NO. 118 OF 2007

**BOROUGH OF PENNSBURY VILLAGE
ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF PENNSBURY
VILLAGE, ALLEGHENY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA,
AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 91 OF 2000, SECTION 204 TO
INCLUDE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DISORDERLY
COMMERCIAL PREMISES STANDARDS;**

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Pennsbury Village has determined, after observation and investigation, that certain locations in the Borough habitually act as public nuisances by playing loud music, engaging in violent activities including fighting and drunken behavior, requiring multiple police visits and generally infringing upon the rights of the other residents of the Borough of Pennsbury Village to the quiet enjoyment of their property; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has found that these habitual disorderly locations impair the safety of the other residents, as they are often the sites of violent confrontations, loud arguments, loud music and require frequent policing; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Borough Council to regulate this disorderly conduct and to protect the health, safety and general welfare of its citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority granted by the Constitution and the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, BE IT ORDAINED AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Pennsbury Village as follows:

Section 204 of Borough of Pennsbury Ordinance Number 91 of 2000 as set forth in Chapter 6 of the Borough Code of Ordinances shall be amended as follows:

Section 204. - Frequenting Disorderly Locations - It shall be unlawful for any person to own, operate, or otherwise supervise and / or to visit or frequent any ill-governed or disorderly house or disorderly commercial premises in the Borough of Pennsbury Village: For the purpose of this Part, "Disorderly House" is defined as a dwelling being maintained for the encouragement of idleness, gaming, drinking, fighting or other misbehavior, or a house which acts as a common nuisance or disturbance to the neighborhood or to the Borough's orderly citizens. For the purpose of this part, "Disorderly Commercial Premises" is defined as any house, business

or premises in which the owner or patrons exhibit any drunken behavior, obscene language or conduct, or any disorderly conduct including but not limited to any loud or unusual noises, fighting or combination thereof, or otherwise acts as a common nuisance or disturbance to the neighborhood or to the Borough's orderly citizens;


