### **Don't Tick Me Off**

Meanwhile there are some things you can do to be proactive and cautious while at the park or outside in general:

- Wear long sleeves and long pants and tuck your clothes in when possible.
- Wearing light-colored clothing to make it easier to spot ticks.
- Do a full-body check of family members, pets, yourself and your gear after being outdoors since ticks can be carried on clothing and pets and attach later.

And a gentle reminder, pets are not permitted in Pennsbury Park.

The Borough has been in contact with County Hauling about ways to prevent the doors from falling off. We look forward to having a workable solution to this issue soon.

Meanwhile, please replace the door (or put it beside the dumpster) if it falls off. **DO NOT THROW IT AWAY.** Replacing dumpster doors costs the Borough money, which could lead to higher refuse fees for all of us.
